2.	I understand that the MCMUA suggests the organization to have a ratio of 1 supervisor for every 5 participants under the age of 18.	
3.	I understand that all cleanups must consist of litter cleanups (tree planting or vegetation removal does not count) and take place no later than May $15^{\rm th}$.	
4.	I understand that all sites must be approved by the proper entities. Morris County will not be held liable if a cleanup is held on unauthorized properties.	
5.	I understand that my non-profit is responsible for separating the recyclable litter from and ensuring the proper disposal of all litter and recycled items following Morris County regulations. Please see Morris Counties list of Recyclable Litter on our website	
6.	I understand that all activities must be tracked for an end-of-year report. This information includes the number of volunteers, total hours, bags of litter picked up, recyclable litter picked up, and acres / road miles cleaned. More information will be given once your application has been submitted.	
7.	I understand that my organization must provide at least one photograph from each cleanup as proof of completion that includes both participants and picked up litter.	
8.	I understand that all MCMUA borrowed supplies MUST be returned to the MCMUA within one week of event. Otherwise, this may impact your funding eligibility for the following year.	
9.	I understand that I must provide non-profit status to the MCMUA with this application.
